SPACE was created in 1989 when directors of a local community foundation became concerned over rapid growth and the increasing loss of greenspace and habitat. As growth and development has accelerated even more today, our current board takes the charge very seriously to promote, protect and preserve natural resources and open space in Spartanburg. This year alone, we have protected 1,644 acres, including the single largest conservation acquisition in Spartanburg County history! I can't wait for you all to experience the jaw-droppingly gorgeous, unspoiled 1,000 acres at Glendale that will be forever unchanged because of SPACE.

I am sure many of you will agree that the world around us at times seems chaotic and harsh. Lately, I try to find balance in the chaos by reminding myself of the Serenity Prayer by Reinhold Niebuhr (go ahead and Google it :)). ### The Glendale Nature Preserve: Coming Soon!

For much of this past year, SPACE staff have been working hard on one of the biggest conservation projects in Spartanburg history - one we weren't sure we'd ever see cross the finish line. The goal was to pull together a competitive bid to purchase a large, beautiful, and historically significant property we'd had in our sights for potential public access for a long time. When we found out about a potential development offer on the property, we knew we had to act fast and try to protect this land. With large tracts of undeveloped land quickly disappearing and rising land costs, it would not be easy to find the funds to compete.

Thankfully, Spartanburg has allies who recognize the importance of local conservation and protecting our natural heritage. We wouldn't have been able to complete this project without the steadfast support from our community leaders like Senators Harvey Peeler and Shane Martin, Spartanburg County Council, the SC Office of Resilience, the SC Conservation Bank staff and Board, and our friends at the Tyger River Foundation, along with many others who championed this project across the finish line!

Together, with the support of the State of South Carolina, the SC Conservation Bank, the SC Office of Resilience, and Spartanburg County, we were able to come up with a plan. The South Carolina Department of Parks, Recreation, and Tourism will hold title to the property and lease it to Spartanburg County Parks and

Recreation to manage as a passive greenspace park for public access. SPACE will hold a conservation easement on the property to ensure it could never be sold for development. Thankfully, the transaction closed in July of 2024, and this incredible piece of land is now owned by SC Parks, Recreation, and Tourism and will be a publicly accessible greenspace forever!

The new park will integrate with SPACE's Glendale Shoals Nature Preserve to create the new Glendale Nature Preserve with nearly 1,000 acres of green space. Crews have been working hard over the last few months installing the first phase of trail infrastructure expanding on the current trail system at the mill ruins site. This will include about two miles of natural surface trail that will extend from the Glendale Shoals trail along Lawson's Fork Creek and connect to Lewis Chapel Road.

Future phases of park development will bring more miles of trails and other outdoor recreation amenities for the residents of Spartanburg to enjoy. PAL: Play, Advocate, Live Well also recently announced that they will begin surveying and engineering work next year on an extension of the Mary Black Rail Trail that will run through the preserve towards Clifton Beach.

Spartanburg County Parks & Recreation plans to have the **first phase** of natural surface trails open to the public in 2025. Stay tuned for more information about the ribbon cutting and grand opening coming soon!




From USC Upstate Engage Green classes to Hurricane Helene clean-up days, our calendar stayed full! 47 Days

## 2024 Year in Review

1,644 ACRES PROTECTED



#### Four Leaf Farm

170 acres of private land near the Spartanburg/Union County line was protected with a conservation easement funded by the SC Conservation Bank.



#### **Arrowhead Farm**

525 acres of private land in Union County with 5 miles of river frontage on the Enoree River was protected with a donated conservation easement. This property is adjacent to 2,352 acres previously protected by the landowners creating a nearly 3,000-acre conservation complex.



#### Glendale Nature Preserve

945 acres with 2.5 miles of river frontage on Lawson's Fork Creek will be Spartanburg County's newest Nature Preserve! This property is adjacent to SPACE's Glendale Shoals Preserve and Wofford College's Environmental Studies campus creating a nearly 1,200-acre conservation corridor in Glendale, SC



#### **New Kayak Launch**

Installed at Heathwood Ave. on Lawson's Fork Creek provides blueway access along a family friendly 2.5-mile stretch of water to the takeout at the Glendale Shoals Preserve. (Note: the launch and this stretch of river still need work after Hurricane Helene. We will share further information when it's safe to paddle again.)




